## About the College(s)

**Eastern Dooars B.Ed. Training College**, Bhatibari, Alipurduar (W.B.), 736121, established on 29<sup>th</sup> October 2003 under the Geographical Society of North Bengal. The institution was initially recognized by NCTE, New Delhi, on 31<sup>st</sup> October 2006 to conduct a one-year B.Ed. programme with an intake of 100 students from the session 2006–2007, and later received recognition on 17<sup>th</sup> March 2009 to offer a one-year M.Ed. programme with an intake of 25 students from 2009–2010. Following the revised NCTE orders in May 2015, both B.Ed. and M.Ed. programmes were extended to two-year durations. The college was first affiliated to the University of North Bengal, and subsequently its affiliation shifted to the West Bengal University of Teachers' Training, Education Planning and Administration in 2015–2017, which was renamed Baba Saheb Ambedkar Education University, Kolkata, on 27<sup>th</sup> June 2022. The D.El.Ed. programme was introduced in 2018 with NCTE recognition and is affiliated to the West Bengal Board of Primary Education. The NAAC-accredited college, also a SWAYAM local chapter, is reputed for quality teacher education, adequate infrastructure, and academic excellence.

**Bakshirhat Mahavidyalaya** was established to fulfill the long-cherished dream of the people of Bakshirhat Block (Tufanganj-II), located in the north-eastern part of Cooch Behar district near the Assam border. An Organizing Committee was formed in June 1999 to initiate the process. With land donated by Bakshirhat High School and additional land purchased through public support, the foundation for the college was laid. Following inspections and approvals from the Higher Education Department, Government of West Bengal, the college received final approval on 13 January 2006. The institution began its academic journey in the 2006–07 session under the affiliation of the University of North Bengal, offering undergraduate courses in several disciplines. In 2015, it came under the affiliation of the Cooch Behar Panchanan Barma University. Over time, the college adopted CBCS and later the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 framework, introducing the NCCF system from the academic session 2023–24.
